DAY CITY TOUR FULL DAY TRIP ITINERARY

Route 1: Old Boma



The Old Boma of Dar es Salaam is the city's oldest stone building and is located on Sokoine drive of Dar es Salaam - Tanzania. It was built in 1866 by Sultan Majid bin Said of Zanzibar close to what was his palace (now demolished). Distinctive features of the building that are noticeable to this date are the Zanzibari style carved wooden doors, the coral stone walls and the shape of its roof.

Route 2: St Joseph Church



The **Saint Joseph's Metropolitan Cathedral** is a Roman Catholic cathedral in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. It is a Gothic church located in Sokoine Drive, facing the harbour, close to the White Fathers' House. It was built by the Germans between 1897 and 1902 and consecrated as a Catholic church in 1905. The cathedral is the seat of the Dar es Salaam archdiocese. One of the most notable features of the church are the stained-glass windows behind the altar.

Route 3: Askari monument



The Askari Monument in Dar es Salaam city, Tanzania, is a memorial to the askari soldiers who fought in the British Carrier Corps in World War I. It is located at the center of a roundabout on Samora Avenue at the perpendicular junction to Maktaba Street and Azikiwe Street, a place that reportedly also marks the exact center of downtown Dar es salaam. It was unveiled in 1927.

Route 4: Dar Es Salaam national Museum



The National Museum of Tanzania is a consortium of five Tanzanian museums whose purpose is to preserve and show exhibits about the history and natural environment of Tanzania. The consortium developed from the National Museum of Dar es Salaam, established in 1934 by Tanganyika governor Harold MacMichael. Four more museums later joined the consortium, namely the Village Museum in Dar es Salaam, the National History Museum and the Arusha Declaration Museum in Arusha, and the Mwalimu Julius K. Nyerere Memorial Museum in Butiama.



Route 5: Rapid transfer Bus station, Kivukoni fish market and Ikulu road & Lunch



Dar es Salaam **bus rapid transit** is such a project. It was planned to improve urban transport by gradually replacing minibuses in Tanzania's largest city.

The Kivukoni **fish market** is a trading spot for fish and seafood that were caught or produced in the Kivukoni area as well as the neighbouring places.

Ikulu is the official residence of the president of Tanzania in Dar es Salaam which was founded by Majid bin Said of Zanzibar in 1865. The State House blends African and Arabian architecture, with wide verandahs and covered walkways.

After the three quick pass over we shall a transfer to the beach area for Lunch, we shall use the ocean road way so that we get chance to pass over the **Tanzanite bridge** while on our way to Mbalamwezi beach for lunch.

Route 6: Makumbusho village kijitonyama



Makumbusho is an administrative ward in the Kinondoni district of the Dar es Salaam Region of Tanzania. the Makumbusho Village (or simply Village Museum in Swahili "Kijiji cha Makumbusho"), an outdoor museum exhibiting 16 traditional houses of the main ethnic groups of Tanzania, and the typical crops of each of these ethnic groups. Founded in 1996, it is one of a consortium of five museums collectively known as the National Museum of Tanzania. The museum is also associated with a cultural center (Makumbusho Cultural Centre), which organizes performances of traditional dances and traditional food tastings Tanzania. Local artists operate in the museum, and artisans display and sell their creations.

After the village museum you will pass by another **Ubungo flyover road** while heading to Mlimani city. The aim is to experience the beautiful roads around Dar city.

Route 7: Mlimani city Mall



Mlimani City is a shopping mall on Sam Nujoma Road, Ubungu, Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. It is one of the largest malls in the country, with an area of 30,000 m². The opening ceremony was in November 2006. It is Tanzania's first indoor air conditioned mall.
